Course Structure
<p>This course is completed partially as a distance learning qualification by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Individual research at home under the guidance of your personal assessor• Telephone assessment appointments to discuss your evidence and/or submitting written evidence to your assessor <p>There is an observation of you in practice at your place of work/employment in order to complete this qualification</p> <p>There are no exams required to achieve the qualification</p>
Course Duration
<p>This course can be completed in as little as 3 weeks. Average learning time is 180 hours. This course has a limit of 3 months to complete from enrolment date.</p>
Costs
<p>This course is fully funded, but there is an initial registration enrolment fee of £25, usually paid by your employer.</p>
Who can enrol for this course?
<p>Must be aged 16+. Anyone who is employed in the health care sector. Anyone who works in health care sector but not necessarily working directly with individual's with dementia (for example admin staff, receptionist, kitchen staff, housekeepers)</p>
Entry Requirements
<p>There are no specific entry requirements however learners should have a minimum of Level 1 in literacy and numeracy or equivalent.</p>
Who is this course suitable for?
<p>This course is designed for</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• health care workers• Individuals already working with individuals with dementia• Individuals wishing to move into a career working with dementia patients• Individuals who work a care setting who may come into contact with individuals with dementia
Certification

What will I learn by taking this course

This course has 5 mandatory units covering

- Dementia awareness
- Understand and implement a person-centred approach to the care and support of individuals with dementia
- Equality, diversity, and inclusion in dementia care practice
- Understand and enable interaction and communication with individuals with dementia
- Approaches to enable rights and choices for individuals with dementia whilst minimising risks

In addition, the learner must choose 4 credits from the list of optional units listed below

- Understand and meet the nutritional requirements of individuals with dementia (Credit value 3)

- Support individuals at the end of life (Credit value 7)
- Contribute to supporting group care activities (Credit Value 3)

- Facilitate person centred assessment, planning, implementation, and review (Credit value 6)
- Support person-centred thinking and planning (Credit Value 5)
- Contribute to supporting individuals in the use of assistive technology (Credit Value 3)
- Introductory awareness of models of disability (Credit Value 2)
